



Make It Yourself Series Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is Make It Yourself: Teen Series at the Scott Family Amazeum?

A: The Maker movement empowers the next generation of creators...YOU! Make It Yourself gives you the tools to learn new skills, explore your creative ideas and discover new passions. In the 3M Tinkering Workshop, you will explore hands-on projects that rely on both traditional and high-tech tools, materials, and technologies. We might explore sewing machines, laser cutters, 3D printing, Silhouette, screen printing, or even soldering!

Q: What ages are allowed to attend Make It Yourself: Teen Series at the Scott Family Amazeum?

A: The series is designed for young people 12-14 years old.

Q: What will drop off and pick up look like?

A: On the first day of the program, care-givers are required to drop their child off in the lobby. After that day, with a signed dismissal form, they can check themselves out of the program.

Q: Is there a discount for Amazeum members?

A: Yes! Amazeum members enjoy a discount on registration and early access to registration.

Q: How do I sign up for the Make It Yourself series?

A: You can sign up for each series online through the Amazeum website. In the 'Programs' menu, select 'Make It Yourself' to find your program of interest.

Q: Will I receive a confirmation of my registration?

A: Yes, the Amazeum will send you an email confirming your online registration. Please check your spam folder and inbox for the email confirmation.

Q: Is financial aid available for the Make It Yourself series?

A: We do offer financial aid for the Make It Yourself series. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis while funds exist and will be reviewed as they are received. Financial aid is available in 25%, 50%, 75%, and 100% amounts. The 100% financial aid tier does require a \$15 administrative fee. Please [apply here](#) to be considered for financial aid. You must apply for financial aid before registering for the workshop series.

Q: How do you recommend children dress for the Make It Yourself series?

A: Workshop participants should dress appropriately. Closed-toe shoes are required. Do not wear loose fitting/dangling sleeves, gloves, jewelry, watches, or anything else that might get caught in a piece of moving equipment. Long hair should be tied

back. Personal protective equipment such as goggles, gloves, and hearing protection will be provided as appropriate.

Q: Who are the educators of the Make It Yourself series?

A: The Amazeum education team consists of highly qualified and trained Programs Educators and the Teen Engagement Specialist. These educators work closely with our Youth Engagement Manager and Tinkering Manager to design and facilitate experiences that are engaging, unique, developmentally appropriate and fun. An Amazeum education team member will be actively present at all times during the series.

Q: We are early birds at our house. Is it okay if we arrive early for the series?

A: Make It Yourself workshops will begin promptly at the start time listed in the program description. Please arrive on time but no earlier than 10 minutes prior to the listed start time.

Q: Can I attend Make It Yourself with my child?

A: Make It Yourself is a drop-off series. In order to foster a cohesive experience, the series is for registered participants only; therefore, adult guardians and non-registered siblings or friends cannot attend.

Q: Can I register for only part of the series, and if so, is there a discount?

A: Make It Yourself is designed to build upon the experiences throughout each experience. Active participation and attendance of the entire series will ensure your teen has a full experience. Partial registration is not available and a discount is not offered for teens that cannot attend the entire series.

Q: I need to cancel my registration. How do I cancel and can I get a refund?

A: At this time we are unable to offer refunds for canceled registrations. Please plan your schedule accordingly so that you can attend your selected program.
